

Fred Meijer White Pine Trail State Park

Comstock Park to Sand Lake

With its close proximity to Grand Rapids, the 24-mile section of the White Pine Trail from Comstock Park to Sand Lake is exceptionally scenic and a very popular day ride.

The trailhead in downtown Comstock Park is a quarter-mile east of the US-131 exit, with ample parking, restaurants and ice cream shops. The trail passes by the Whitecaps ballpark and heads north along the Grand River.

A bridge over West River Drive takes you north to downtown Belmont and another nice staging area at Rogue River Park. From there, the trail coasts downhill into the Rogue River valley and downtown Rockford. The Rockford dam is a popular gathering area to relax, enjoy lunch and ice cream, or just soak up the scenery.

The staging area in Cedar Springs is just two blocks east of Main Street and near several eateries and a brewery. The trail is relatively flat and straight as it races north to downtown Sand Lake and more trailside amenities.

Snowmobiling is permitted during the winter season north of Russell Road.
